With so much confusion about this emerging style in Australia, winemaker Sarah Fletcher has shown determination to make authentic Pinot Grigio in the true Italian style--vibrant and exciting, with its lively dance of crisp acid and sharp fruit flavours. It works perfectly with the lean Adelaide Hills fruit she focuses on, bursting with fresh flavours from having the fruit picked early in vinatge. The resultingly sexy is tight and zesty, with wonderful lean pear and bright citrus flavours in a generous middle palate, and firm acid ensuring great length to the flavours. If you're befuddled by what constitutes good Pinot Grigio, try this for size.
